



ADMISSION PROCESS



Application Requirements

In addition to the entry grade requirements, international students must fulfill the following criteria:



English eligibility

According to the laws, permanent Canadian residents cannot attend as international students (grade 7-11). Students must hold a valid CAQ and study permit.

Testing and documentation



- Take the TOEFL or IELTS or CAEL test (for English as a second language applicants only)
Score ranges: 90 for iBT TOEFL, 500 for paper-based TOEFL, 6-6.5 for IELTS, 70 for CAEL
- Provide immigration documents
- Provide a certified English translation of report cards



Tuition Information

International students on a study permit pay an additional international student fee of about \$4,400 (grades 7-11).



When to Apply

Throughout the year, up to one year prior to the intended year of entry.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM



English as a Second Language (ESL)

LCC does not offer ESL classes. Proficiency in English is required and determined during the admission test for all applicants.



French as a Second Language

In most cases, international students who do not have a foundation in French take introductory French classes in addition to their regular program (possible additional cost).



International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

LCC is the only English high school in Quebec to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).



Pre-University/Grade 12 Program

The one-year university preparatory program positions students for direct entrance to university anywhere in the world.

Student Orientation

Orientation sessions introduce international students to the City of Montreal and LCC life.



Student Wellness

The LCC student wellness model ensures that individuals and teams of professionals are in place to prevent or manage student issues early. Onsite school counsellors and a nurse are available at all times.



Group Sessions

Monthly meetings ensure that international students are adjusting well and receive answers to their questions.



Advisory

Advisors are advocates for students, providing support and counselling on issues relating to academics, co-curriculars or social and personal concerns.



Clubs & Activities

Diverse clubs and co-curricular activities allow students to pursue special interests, develop new talents and foster leadership potential.
