


What does the new Canadian Food Guide mean for you?

If you haven't heard, Health Canada released its new food guide on January 22nd of 2019. The previous edition was released more than 10 years ago in 2007. This newest food guide is being looked at as having more up-to-date information, but it is also being given credit for conveying this information more clearly and more effectively. After only a couple of days have passed since its release, health experts and medical researchers have already begun to weigh in.

Having done away with emphasis on complicated measurements and serving portions, Health Canada's new manual provides fewer strict rules and quantities, and more broader guidelines on how to live and eat

healthily. In other words, Canadians will no longer need to scratch their heads over how much a serving of banana is. While their approach to guiding Canadian Health has been much simplified, Health Canada has reiterated the importance of eating plenty of healthy fruits and vegetables, as well as whole grains and protein foods.

Build Bridges, not walls

A southern border wall in the United States represents a gross misuse of the government's funds and is the product of three years of fear-mongering and misinformation. This analysis is for two main reasons, the first being its ineffectiveness at achieving its goals, and the second being the cost and how the money could be spent.

To understand how effective a wall can be, we first need to examine the problems it is trying to solve. Judging by what President Trump has talked about, it is for two main things. The first being decrease the rate at which illegal immigrants enter the United States, consequently decreasing the supposed crime they are committing. The second being mitigating the drug crisis in the United States.

Regarding the former, it is true that a government has a right to secure their borders. Regardless, this "plan" is an ineffective way to solve the problems that have been presented. Although it is true that in some cases illegal immigrants are a net negative on our economy, although I do not think it is nearly as bad as others would make you think. The thing to look at is how these people got here. According to a report by the Center For Migration Studies, Visa

the Center For Migration Studies, Visa overstays have outnumbered people who enter the country illegally at the Southern border every year since 2007. This statistic means that the majority of people entering the country do not cross the border. Furthermore, in an article written in 2018, by NPR, National Public Radio, they say, "The report's authors estimate that the number of total visa overstays was 600,000 more than the total number of border crossers and that in 2014, visa overstays accounted for two-thirds of all new undocumented immigrants." With this data, it is clear that a wall wouldn't stop the majority of data, it is clear that a wall wouldn't stop the majority of illegal immigration. This is not even mentioning the fact that most of the people who do cross the border are fleeing poverty or persecution. The result of this fact is that illegal immigrants are more likely to do whatever it takes to get into the United States. This desperation looks like taking rafts across the Gulf of Mexico similar to what we saw in Europe with the Syrian Refugee Crisis.

The second goal of the wall is to stop the illicit importation of drugs. Again, facts prove that this goal is unachievable. According to U.S. Customs and Border Protection statistics, 90 percent of heroin seized along the border, 88 percent of cocaine, 87 percent of methamphetamine, and 80 percent of fentanyl in the first 11 months of the 2018 fiscal year was caught trying to be smuggled in at legal crossing points. Because it is coming through at *legal* points of entry, a wall wouldn't do anything to stop it. Even if all of the drugs coming into the United States comes from illegally crossing southern border and the wall does stop 100% of that drug trade, it stands to reason that the cartels will just

get the drugs in through other routes. They already transport a lot through planes and smuggling on ships, so if you build a wall, all they will do is go around it. Although stopping illegal immigration and stopping the drug crisis sound like good things, if you spend more than 15 minutes researching you will realize a wall cannot do these things.

The second main reason we shouldn't build a wall is because of its price. Although Trump is only asking for 5 billion dollars for the wall, Reuters estimated the price to be 21.6 billion dollars. This estimate is including the 750 million dollars per year maintenance costs. This investment would be a huge amount of money, although it may seem small considering the total US budget is 3 trillion dollars. Realistically, only 1.1 billion of that money can be re-allocated, according to nationalpriorities.org. The problem with the wall's price is twofold. The first is the fact that it is taking away funding from other, more effective programs. Some examples of other programs could be increased funding for border patrol agents to catch smugglers, or drones surveying the border looking for illegal crossings etc. Throwing this much money into a solution we already proved was ineffective is not a good idea. The second problem is who is paying the money. As we have all been told, "Mexico is paying for the wall." Except, as expected, they are not. The new rhetoric is that they are paying for it through the new NAFTA deal, although it has yet to be seen how profitable this deal actually is for the United States. The wall will not work, and costs far too much. We should not support this.

Where's my Wall-dough?

“We simply cannot allow people to pour into the U.S., undetected, undocumented, unchecked and circumventing the line of people who are waiting patiently, diligently, lawfully to become immigrants in this country.” This is a recent quote from the President of the United States, Donald Trump, when addressing a rally.

To many, this quote is just one more reason to call the president a racist, but, to some, this is just a quote from Barack Obama from 2005. The reason I said that this quote was from Donald Trump is to illustrate that this issue has nothing to do with race, discrimination or bigotry, but everything to do with finding the best way to protect the southern border of the U.S.A. from both illegal immigrants and drug trafficking.

This being said, there are two main reasons why a border wall would be the best way to provide the security needed for the border and reduce the immigration epidemic; these two reasons are cost and the reduction of people being able to cross the land border.



Although I realize that not every illegal immigrant or every pound of drug is going through the southern border that would be protected by the wall, the amount of taxpayer dollars that would be saved and the growth to the economy that would come out of building the wall would be worth it.

The general consensus of those who don't believe in the wall is that first, most of the illegal immigrants are just overstaying their visas and that most drugs are going through legal ports. Even with this being true, it's a lot harder to track down people who have overstayed their visa. Based on the FY18 ICE (a yearly report documenting various statistics ICE has obtained) budget document over the last 3 years the amount of money that is being allocated to protecting the borders has actually increased yet illegal immigration is at one of its all time highs. A full reworking of the current immigration system and how we enforce it needs to take place, which many who believe in the wall aren't opposed to; they actually support it. The argument isn't that Donald Trump's wall is the perfect one and only savior to border protection but rather a start to stronger border protection that make legal immigration better as well as preventing illegal immigration.

In terms of drugs, just because most come from legal points of entry doesn't mean we should forget about every other point of entry. If we increase the vetting of ports and such, the drug dealer will turn to other ways of getting their supply in. Ultimately, we need all points of entry to be secure, which includes the southern physical border.

Based on the experts at the CIS (center for immigration studies), the wall, although expensive, would “pay for itself” over about a decade or so based on how much taxes would be saved in relation to the amount of people crossing the border and its effect on the economy. It's likely that the the wall will be a 1:1 ratio of dollars saved vs dollars spent over time (will likely cost a little more). Insofar as both sides of the argument agree that the fewer ILLEGAL immigrants that a country holds is ultimately a good thing, the cost becomes negligible.

The second reason why a physical barrier is a good option is because it removes some incentive to try and cross the border illegally as the risk surpasses the reward. The reason this is important is because insofar as honest people are more likely to take legal means of getting in to the US the only effect that would happen are that people have less incentive to take radical means of getting into the country therefore they will likely do one of two things; either they will opt for legal immigration or they will stay and live their lives in the country they are currently in. The reason why the second option isn't necessarily a bad thing is because if people keep fleeing these countries, these countries will never make any meaningful growth and therefore continue to be undesirable places to live.

The security of the border is of the utmost priority of the government. The wall is a clear step in the right direction for the future of border security.

420 Running out of Money?



Ovechkin: the greatest goal scorer of our generation

Wayne Gretzky. #99. The Great One. Most of Wayne Gretzky's records have been considered by many as being unbreakable. However, as one current player's career evolves, it is looking like we might have a challenger on one of the Great One's records.

Anyone that has ever talked to me about hockey knows that I've been a Washington Capitals fan for quite some time. I have 'suffered' through numerous playoff collapses even though those rosters were some of the best ever constructed. I watched as the 1 seeded Capitals fell to the 8 seeded Canadiens. I watched as they got swept by Tampa Bay in 2011. I watched as they lost back to back years to the Rangers. I watched as they blew a 3-1 lead to the Rangers two years later. I watched as they lost back to back years to the Penguins in the second round with perhaps some of the greatest rosters ever assembled.

And then finally, some eight years later, I watched Alex Ovechkin triumphantly raise the Stanley Cup over his head in what felt like one of the better sports moments of the year. However, there has remained one constant throughout all these playoff experiences and that is the captain, Alex Ovechkin.

As I sat in Capital One Arena and watched the Capitals power play take position, already ahead 2-0 over the Bruins after raising their championship banner, what ensued shocked very few people. Niklas Backstrom took the puck down low and saucered a pass to Ovechkin who fired it top shelf for goal No. 608. It's the same play that the pair have been doing

for numerous years, yet defences have yet to find a way to stop it.

Now let's do some number crunching. As of today, Alex has 36 goals and leads the league at age 33. He has a career total of 643 goals, which puts him 251 behind Gretzky's NHL record of 894. Assuming he continues to play in the NHL for the next seven years and finishes this season with 50 goals, he would need an average of 34 goals over these seven years.

Seems doable, right? Well, Ovechkin will turn 34 next September and has two more years remaining on his contract. There are two main reasons which may keep him from breaking the record.

First, his numbers may decline. Let's face it, not many 33 year olds are producing at the rate he currently is, so one can realistically predict a drop off. However, if he front loads these next couple of years, he takes some of the pressure off the years leading up to his 40s. Anything is possible and only time will tell.

Second, the NHL recently blocking players from playing in the Olympics may result in Ovechkin heading back to the KHL (Kontinental Hockey League) to get another shot at winning an Olympic gold medal. That would cut short his career, greatly reducing his chances of catching the Great One.

However, when everything is said and done, Ovechkin will go down as the greatest goal scorer of this generation and perhaps of all time. And, anyway, who had Alex leading the league in goals at age 33? Probably only me.

How AI is changing the way we live, through chess

In 2017, Google's Deepmind developed an AlphaZero, a program that can *learn* to play any game while just given the instructions. AlphaZero has recently entered the news cycle because it just went undefeated against previous best computer program at chess in a 1000 game match, making AlphaZero the undisputed chess champion. The way it works is very complicated, but it boils down to playing itself thousands of times and learning about its past mistakes and successes. Although there was a lot of people supporting Google and AlphaZero, some criticized the result, claiming that it was only achievable because of the super computers at Google. The program has already been modified to play many other games, like connect-4, so this technology has been proven to be flexible as well as powerful. This same type of technology could be used in fields like stock investments, management, and advertising.
